USING THE NDTA™ CONTEMPORARY PRACTICE MODEL IN TREATING INFANTS AND TODDLERS COURSE - WORKSHOP

Total contact hours: **19 hours**

This introductory to intermediate level course is designed for PT's, OTs, and SLP's who work with or desire to work with infants & toddlers with neuromuscular challenges (birth up to 3 years).

Atypical development will be compared to typical development and will be reviewed as to how infants and toddlers develop functional movement behaviors. The NDTA™ Contemporary Practice Model will be presented as it relates to the assessment and treatment of the infant and toddler. Observation of infant movement will reinforce typical development. Experiential movement labs will be used to facilitate one another through movement transitions and to learn handling techniques on an infant-sized doll. Observation of assessment and treatment sessions will show treatment and handling techniques on a client. Problem-solving and discussion will be utilized to assist in planning treatment sequences and functional goals.

5. facilitate movement transitions appropriate for the infant/toddler population on another adult and on a doll in lab.
6. promote carry-over and participation in the home and community environments via daily activities.
